A little bit of history...

The European Top 16 is the major competition of the continent in table tennis! The first edition was held in Yugoslavia in 1971 and was competing with the 12 best players (Top 12). Since 2015, the European Table Tennis Union (ETTU) has decided to extend the tournament to the 16 best players.

Top 16 Cup Montreux 2018

In Montreux, the Top 16 will bring together this year the 15 best table tennis players in both men and women categories, as well as Switzerland's best-ranked man and woman.

It will be played in a knockout format, which will start at the round of 16 stage. The draw will take place the day before the tournament, on Friday 2nd February at 6:00pm.

Each game will be contested in four winning sets of eleven points (with two points difference).

The Top 3 men and women qualify for the ITTF Men's and Women's World Cups later this year.

ITTF Women's World Cup will be in Chengdu (China), 28-30 September and the ITTF Men's World Cup will take place in Paris (France) 19-21 October.



OVTCHAROV Dimitrij

WR: 1st

Germany

Dimitrij "Dima" Ovtcharov is one of the favorites of the competition. A three-time champion and recent World Cup winner in Liège, Dima is the hottest player at the moment. He has even reached the world's number one ranking in January.



BOLL Timo

WR: 3rd

Date of birth: 08/03/1981

Germany

Timo Boll is the other favorite of the tournament. A true legend of table tennis, the 36-year-old German is very experienced. He was a runner-up in the last World Cup and could take his revenge against his compatriot Ovtcharov.



GAUZY Simon

WR: 9th

Date of birth: 25/10/1994

France

Frenchman Simon Gauzy is a serious contender. 4th at the last World Cup, he could be the one to prevent a German victory. He took the 3rd place at the last edition of the Top 16, in Antibes.

WR: 25th / Belarus
Date of birth: 17/04/1976

The Belarusian is the oldest player in the tournament. His experience can allow him to go far and he is seeking revenge for last year where he lost his 3 matches in the group phase.



FILUS Ruwen
WR: 18th / Germany
Date of birth: 14/02/1988

One of the only defenders of the tournament, the German will participate for the first time in the Top 16.



FREITAS Marcos WR: 12th / Portugal Date of birth: 08/04/1988

Accustomed to the Swiss Open in Lausanne, the Portuguese is well known by the Swiss audience. Winner of the Top 12 in Lausanne in 2014, can he repeat his performance in Montreux?



KARLSSON Kristian WR: 22nd / Sweden Date of birth: 08/08/1991

The Swedish had reached 4th place in the 2015 Top 16 in Gondomar (Portugal). Will he once again be able to reach the semi-finals in Montreux?

Runner-up last year in Antibes, Shibaev surprised everyone. He will be keen to show that he did not reach the final by chance.

In 2016, he made history by winning the European Championship against his compatriot Gauzy in the final.

MEN PLAYERS TOP 16 CUP



WR: 40th / Portugal Date of birth: 28/07/1986

The Swiss public has already had the opportunity to see the Portuguese play in Lausanne during the Swiss Open.



The 37-year-old Greek player is still spectacular with his defensive game. He had not passed the group stage at the last Top 16 in Antibes.



Very good doubles player with several European medals. But since 2015, he has progressed a lot in singles. Note that he is not related to Kristian Karlsson.

Multiple Austrian champion, Fegerl is an experienced player. He notably helped bring the European Team Championship title to Austria on 2015.




MORET Rachel

Qualified thanks to her status of the No. 1 Swiss woman, the "Vaudoise" will have to fight hard to try to go through the group stage. She can rely on a good track record at the national level, with no less than 16 titles gleaned (5 in singles, 5 in mixed doubles and 6 in mixed doubles). Internationally, she also won the Chile Open. She has just been elected "Vaudoise" sportswoman of the year 2017 and dreams of participating in the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games and has made it one of her major goals.


WOMEN PLAYERS

WR: 20th / Hungary
Date of birth: 13/01/1985

The 32-year-old, fifth in the European standings, also has a good chance of winning. She is a double champion of Europe.



SOLJA Petrissa WR: 70th / Germany Date of birth: 11/03/1994

She's bronze medalist in mixed doubles at World Championships in 2017 with Fang Bo. She was finalist in Antibes (Top 16) last year.

This year, she's seeking revenge.



POLCANOVA Sofia WR: 22nd / Austria Date of birth: 03/09/1994

The Austrian has recently shown a good level in the league in which she beat Tetyana Bilenko, Britt Eerland and Yu Fu.




WR: 38th / Poland Date of birth: 30/07/1986

The Pole has already won the Top 12 in Europe, the predecessor of the Top 16. The defender won bronze in the 2015 World Cup in doubles.

She won the DHS Open in Lausanne last year. The Swede lost in the quarterfinals in the Top 16 last year.

The 22-year-old is the youngest of 16 participants. She participated in the victory of Romania in the European Championship.



MONTEIRO DODEAN Daniela

WR: 108th / Romania Date of birth: 13/01/1988

She won the European Team Championships, as well as the title of European Mixed Doubles Champion with her husband, Joao Monteiro.




NI Xialian WR: 55th / Luxembourg Date of birth: 04/07/1963

32 years separates Luxembourgeoise from Szocs, the youngest participant. At 54 she still belongs to the European's best.

MIKHAILOVA Polina WR: 49th/ Russia Date of birth: 31/08/1986

She participated in the last Olympic Games in Rio in 2016, where she lost in the second round.



BILENKO Tetyana WR: 95th / Ukraine Date of birth: 23/11/1983

The 34-year-old Ukrainian competed in the European Team Championships 2017. In the last Top 16, she lost in the group stage.



WINTER Sabine WR: 72nd / Germany Date of birth: 27/09/1992

In Antibes 2017, she reached a very good 3rd place. In doubles, she won gold with Shan Xiaona at the 2016 European Championships.



PAVLOVICH Viktoria WR: 42nd / Belarus Date of birth: 08/05/1978

The 39-year-old Belarusian, European champion in 2010 and 2012, relies above all on her defense game to make the show.
